He has been involved in the academic accreditation of psychoanalytic programmes at the Tavistock Clinic and the University of East London over many years, including a substantial programme of doctoral research in Child Psychotherapy. His books include 'The Good Society and the Inner World' (1991), 'Reason and Unreason' (2001), 'Narratives of Love and Loss: Studies in Modern Children's Fiction' (1989/2002), 'Mirror to Nature: Drama Psychoanalysis and Society' (2002) both with Margaret Rustin, and 'The Inner World of Doctor Who: Psychoanalytic Reflections in Time and Space', with Ian MacRury. He co-edited 'Social Defences against Anxiety' with David Armstrong (2016) and with Margaret Rustin is co-author of 'Reading Klein' (2017).
