Dear Dr. Ferenczi,

You are due to arrive, according to the London office of the Hamburg-America Line, either on Friday, the 10th, or Saturday, the 11th, of June. My plan was to meet you at Southampton with the car, and take our way to London in time for your lecture on Monday, the 13th. The inclusion of a day at Southsea with the Innans can easily be managed. Southsea is about 30 kilometres from Southampton. If you arrive on Saturday early or Friday late, we could go through Salisbury, Old Sarum (Roman camp), to Stonehenge (ancient British monuments), and have lunch and tea on the Wiltshire hills, stay in a country inn, and arrive for Sunday (when Innans will certainly be free) at Southsea. On Monday morning we could go along the south coast, Monday afternoon arrive in London, Monday evening your lecture.

May I suggest that for this motor trip of two or three days you arrange your luggage in two suit-cases, and we will have the heavy luggage sent to London from the boat and delivered at an hotel or our house, as you prefer.
